

4D-Nucleofector[™] Protocol for CCRF-CEM Cells For 4D-Nucleofector[™] X Unit—Transfection in Suspension

Human T lymphoblast cell line from acute lymphoblastic leukemia; lymphoblastoid cells



Transfection efficiency and viability of CCRF-CEM cells 24 hours post Nucleofection. CCRF-CEM cells were transfected with program DC-100 in 20 μ L Nucleocuvette^{tor} Strips (0.4 μ g pmaxGFP^{tor} Vector) or 100 μ L Nucleocuvette^{tor} Vessels (2 μ g pmaxGFP^{tor} Vector). 24 hours post Nucleofection, transfection efficiency was analyzed on a FACSCalibur^{tor} (Becton Dickinson). Cell viability was determined using ViaLight^{tor} Plus Assay and normalized to untransfected control sample.

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Storage and Stability

Note

Store Nucleofector[™] Solution, Supplement and pmaxGFP[™] Vector at 4°C. For long-term storage, pmaxGFP[™] Vector is ideally stored at -20°C. The expiration date is printed on the solution box. Once the Nucleofector[™] Supplement is added to the Nucleofector[™] Solution, it is stable for three months at 4°C 4D-Nucleofector[™] Solutions can only be used with conductive polymer Nucleocuvette[™] Vessels, i.e. in the 4D-Nucleofector[™] and the 96-well Shuttle[™] System. They are not compatible with the Nucleofector[™] II/2b Device.

Required Material

Note

Please make sure that the supplement is added to the Nucleofector^m Solution prior to use. For preparing aliquots, mix Nucleofector^m Solution and Supplement in a ratio of 4.5 : 1 (see Table 1).

- 4D-Nucleofector[™] System (4D-Nucleofector[™] Core and X Unit)
- Supplemented 4D-Nucleofector™ Solution at room temperature
- Supplied 100 µL single Nucleocuvette[™] or 20 µL 16-well Nucleocuvette[™] Strips
- Compatible tips for 20 μL Nucleocuvette[™] Strips: epT.I.P.S. [US/ CDN: Eppendorf North America, Cat. No. 2491.431, Rest of World: Eppendorf AG, Cat. No. 0030073.266], Matrix TallTips[™] [Matrix Technologies Corp., Cat. No. 7281] or LTS Tips [Rainin Instrument, LLC, Cat. No. SR-L10F, SR/SS-L250S, SR/SS-L300S]. Before using other types of pipette tips, please ensure they reach the bottom of the Nucleocuvette[™] wells without getting stuck
- Supplied pmaxGFP[™] Vector, stock solution 1 µg/µL

Note

When using pmaxGFP[™] Vector as positive control, dilute the stock solution to an appropriate working concentration that allows pipetting of the recommended amounts per sample (see Table 3). Make sure that the volume of substrate solution added to each sample does not exceed 10% of the total reaction volume (2 µL for 20 µL reactions; 10 µL for 100 µL reactions).

- Substrate of interest, highly purified, preferably by using endotoxin-free kits; A260:A280 ratio should be at least 1.8
- Cell culture plates of your choice
- Culture medium: RPMI 1640 [Lonza; Cat. No. BE12-167F] supplemented with 2mM Glutamine, 1mM Sodium Pyruvate Solution and 10mM Hepes, 90%, fetal bovine serum 10%
- Prewarm appropriate volume of culture medium to 37°C (see Table 2)
- Appropriate number of cells/sample (see Table 3)

1. Pre Nucleofection

Cell culture recommendations

- 1.1 Replace media every 2 days
- 1.2 Passage cells 3 times a week. Cells should not be used for Nucleofection[™] after passage number 30
- 1.3 Seed out $4 6 \times 10^4$ cells/cm²
- 1.4 Subculture 2 days before Nucleofection
- 1.5 Optimal density for Nucleofection: 1.0 1.2 x 10⁶ cells/mL.
 Higher cell densities may cause lower Nucleofection Efficiencies

2. Nucleofection

For Nucleofection sample contents and recommended Nucleofector™ Program, please refer to Table 3.

- 2.1 Please make sure that the entire supplement is added to the Nucleofector[™] Solution
- 2.2 Start 4D-Nucleofector[™] System and create or upload experimental parameter file (for details see device manual)
- 2.3 Select/Check for the appropriate Nucleofector[™] Program (see Table 3)
- Prepare cell culture plates by filling appropriate number of wells with desired volume of recommended culture media (see Table 4) and pre-incubate/equilibrate plates in a humidified 37°C/5% CO₂ incubator
- 2.5 Pre-warm an aliquot of culture medium to 37°C (see Table 4)
- 2.6 Prepare plasmid DNA or pmaxGFP[™] Vector or siRNA (see Table 3)
- 2.7 Count an aliquot of the cells and determine cell density
- 2.8 Centrifuge the required number of cells (see Table 3) at 125xg for 8 minutes at room temperature. Remove supernatant completely
- 2.9 Resuspend the cell pellet carefully in room temperature 4D-Nucleofector[™] Solution (see Table 3)
- 2.10 Prepare mastermixes by dividing cell suspension according to number of substrates
- 2.11 Add required amount of substrates to each aliquot (max. 10% of final sample volume)
- 2.12 Transfer mastermixes into the Nucleocuvette[™] Vessels

Note

As leaving cells in Nucleofector[™] Solution for extended periods of time may lead to reduced transfection efficiency and viability it is important to work as quickly as possible. Avoid air bubbles while pipetting

2.13 Gently tap the Nucleocuvette[™] Vessels to make sure the sample covers the bottom of the cuvette

- 2.14 Place Nucleocuvette™ Vessel with closed lid into the retainer of the 4D-Nucleofector™ X Unit. Check for proper orientation of the Nucleocuvette™ Vessel
- 2.15 Start Nucleofection Process by pressing the "Start" on the display of the 4D-Nucleofector™ Core Unit (for details, please refer to the device manual)
- 2.16 After run completion, carefully remove the Nucleocuvette[™] Vessel from the retainer
- 2.17 Resuspend cells with pre-warmed medium (for recommended volumes see Table 2). Mix cells by gently pipetting up and down two to three times. When working with the 100 µL Nucleocuvette[™] use the supplied pipettes and avoid repeated aspiration of the sample
- 2.18 Plate desired amount of cells in culture system of your choice (for recommended volumes see Table 2).

3. Post Nucleofection

3.1 Incubate the cells in humidified $37^{\circ}C/5\%$ CO₂ incubator until analysis. Gene expression or down regulation, respectively, is often detectable after only 4 – 8 hours
